

## Homework Policy - Economics

The Economics Department supports the principles and guidelines contained in the Tring School Home Learning Policy.

Pupils can expect to be set homework after almost every lesson. This may take the form of reading to support work done in previous lessons or to prepare students for future lessons. There may also be questions to answer, notes to be made, independent research, preparation for presentations and of course, revision.

In Y12, pupils will have end-of-unit multiple choice tests in which they have to score more than 40% to avoid a retest. Pupils in both years must score at least 70% in definitions tests, which occur roughly every month. From November of Y12, data response questions and/or essays will be set approximately every two weeks.

It is also hoped that as the course progresses, pupils will take opportunities to increase their awareness of current economic events by reading a quality newspaper, watching appropriate TV programmes, looking at topical economics websites and/or reading economics magazines. Newspapers and economics magazines are available in the School's Learning Centre and a Wider Reading list is published for each year group.
