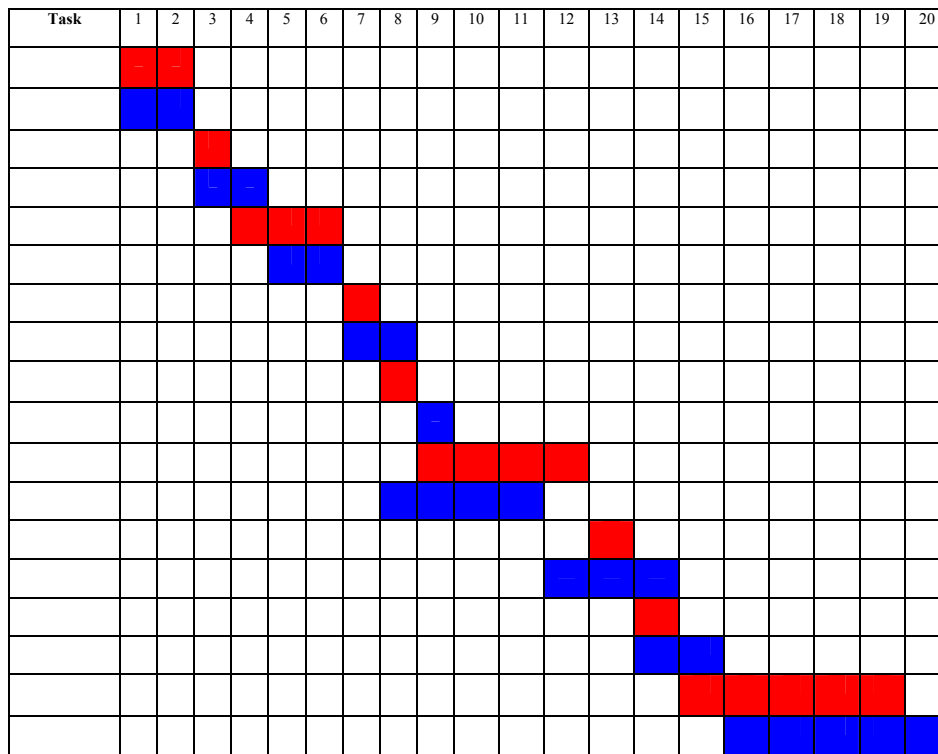


Graphic Products GCSE Coursework Page Check

Objective 6 – Testing and Evaluating

Page 1 (2 lessons) Planned Gantt Chart V Actual Time Taken – on this page you need to have your original Gantt Chart with two sets of rows for each task. You must then in one colour show your PLANNED time and in another colour show your ACTUAL time.



Red=PLANNED time Blue=ACTUAL time

You can then compare them and say why things may not have gone exactly to plan and also why things did go to plan

Pages 2 (2 lessons) Questionnaire or Dialogue with User – testing is something that is essential to evaluating a good product. You should either produce a questionnaire to your target market OR produce a dialogue of your user using 6-10 questions. Please make sure that you ask what they like/dislike, does the product meet the Specification and what would they improve about the product

Page 3 (2 lessons) Results/Graphs/Analysis –as with objective 2 you need to show your results of the testing. You could add one or two photos of your final product and then evaluate what the results from the questionnaire or dialogue showed. You can also put graphs if you asked several people your questionnaire and comment on the findings.

Page 4 (2 lessons) Evaluating the Specification – the easiest way to do this is to get your amended Specification from the end of objective 4 and then in a different colour comment on whether you met the specification point and how you achieved this, if you didn't why not and what could you have done differently

Page 5 (1 lesson) Modifications – this page is about what changes you would make to the final product to improve it. Please make sure that you do not just say something like I am going to change the colour. Say WHY you are going to change the colour, what colour you would change it to and how your testing has led you to this modification. At the end you need to write a small paragraph about your overall feeling about the project and how successful you think you have been and why
